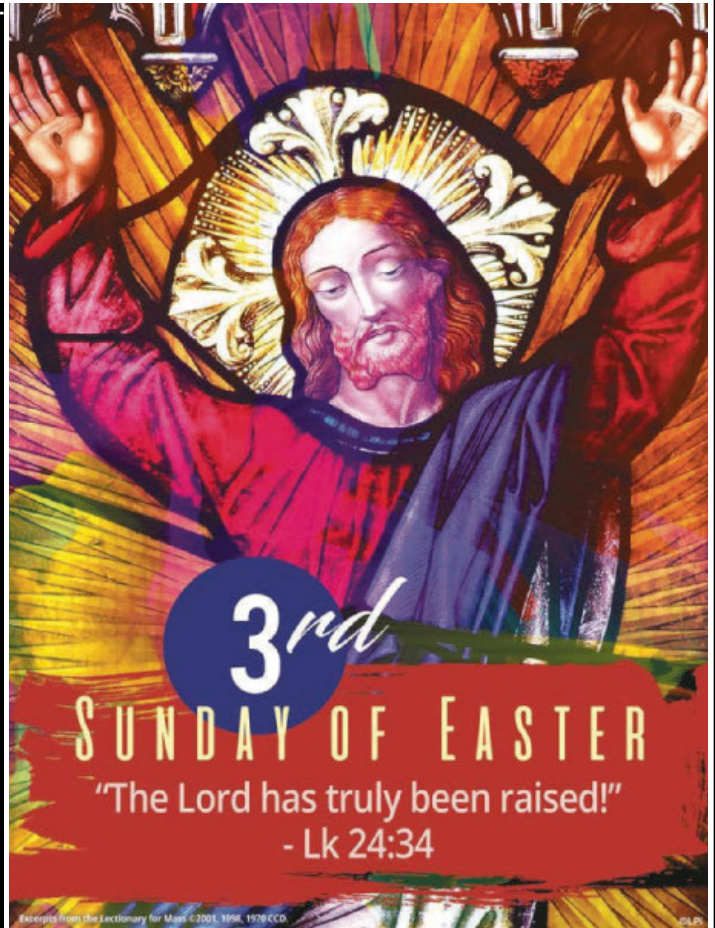

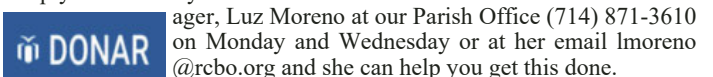

PASTORS PONDERINGS

Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday, the Third Sunday of Easter, we are given the opportunity to reflect on the lovely passage about the two random disciples of Jesus encountering him on the road to Emmaus on the day of his Resurrection.

The passage, which is also proclaimed on the evening of Easter Sunday, serves as a reminder to us that Jesus really for all of us, not merely a special group of people. Of the two disciples who Jesus joined on the road, all we know of them is the name of one of them, Cleopas and the other disciple's name is completely anonymous. He (or she) could have been one of us.

But Jesus chose to join them on their walk home from Jerusalem to Emmaus. And during this time, Jesus did what we today do every time we go to Mass: he explained the Scriptures, the Law and the Prophets, to them, and afterwards after a blessing, he revealed himself to them in the breaking of bread.

We sometimes forget how old our celebration of the Eucharist is:

Already in the New Testament we hear four versions of the Institution Narrative that Jesus took bread, said the blessing and said "Take and eat, this is my body" and then took the cup said the blessing and said "Take and drink, this is cup/chalice of my blood, the new and everlasting Covenant. Do this in memory of me." We hear this narrative presented at the Last Supper in the Gospels Matthew, Mark and Luke, as well as in Paul's 1st Letter to the Corinthians. John's Gospel doesn't have the institution narrative, but he devotes the whole of the 6th chapter of his Gospel to Jesus' "Bread of Life" discourse in which he arguably explains its meaning.

Then we hear, repeatedly in the post Resurrection accounts in the Gospels that the emerging Christian Community met together on Sunday, the 1st Day of the Week, as we do today, and that they recognized Jesus "in the breaking of bread."

In the 200 years that follow, we read the Apologetics of St. Justin Martyr of Rome a presentation of the Mass, including a liturgy of the word, intercessions, a collection (and distribution of the collected goods to those in need), and finally a celebration of a ritualized meal involving the breaking of bread at its end. And at roughly the same time St. Hippolytus of Rome even conserved the prayer used at that time in Rome for that ritualized Eucharist which forms the basis of our Second Eucharistic Prayer.

So what we do here in celebrating the Eucharist is rooted in the very Gospels that we proclaim and was already ritualized in the early centuries of the Church.

We too seek to walk with Jesus through life. Let us appreciate that this journey is one that our brothers and sisters have been taking together with Jesus through the whole history of the Church.

Happy Third Sunday of Easter to all!

**PENSAMIENTOS DE NUESTRO PARROCO**

Estimados feligreses,

Este domingo, tercer domingo de Pascua, tenemos la oportunidad de reflexionar sobre el hermoso pasaje en el que dos discípulos de Jesús se encuentran con él en el camino de Emaús el día de su Resurrección.

El pasaje, que también se proclama en la tarde del Domingo de Pascua, nos sirve para recordar que Jesús realmente es para todos nosotros, no sólo para un grupo especial de personas. De los dos discípulos con los que Jesús se reunió en el camino, sólo sabemos el nombre de uno de ellos, Cleofás, y el nombre del otro discípulo es completamente anónimo. Podría haber sido uno de nosotros.

Pero Jesús decidió unirse a ellos en su camino de Jerusalén a Emaús. Y durante ese tiempo, Jesús hizo lo que hoy hacemos cada vez que vamos a Misa: les explicó las Escrituras, la Ley y los Profetas, y después, tras una bendición, se les reveló al partir el pan.

A veces olvidamos lo antigua que es nuestra celebración de la Eucaristía:

Ya en el Nuevo Testamento oímos cuatro versiones del relato de la Institución: Jesús tomó el pan, pronunció la bendición y dijo: "Tomad y comed, esto es mi cuerpo"; después tomó el cáliz, pronunció la bendición y dijo: "Tomad y bebed, esto es la copa/el cáliz de mi sangre, la Alianza nueva y eterna. Haced esto en memoria mía". Escuchamos esta narración presentada en la Última Cena en los Evangelios de Mateo, Marcos y Lucas, así como en la 1^a Carta de Pablo a los Corintios. El Evangelio de Juan no contiene la narración de la institución, pero dedica todo el capítulo 6 de su Evangelio al discurso de Jesús sobre el "Pan de Vida", en el que podría decirse que explica su significado.

Luego oímos, repetidamente en los relatos posteriores a la Resurrección en los Evangelios, que la naciente Comunidad Cristiana se reunía el domingo, el primer día de la semana, como hacemos hoy, y que reconocían a Jesús "al partir el pan".

En los 200 años siguientes, leemos en la Apologética de San Justino Mártir de Roma una presentación de la Misa, que incluye una liturgia de la palabra, intercesiones, una colecta (y distribución de lo recogido a los necesitados) y, por último, la celebración de una comida ritualizada que incluye la fracción del pan al final de la misma. Y, más o menos en la misma época, San Hipólito de Roma conservó incluso la oración que se utilizaba entonces en Roma para esa Eucaristía ritualizada y que constituye la base de nuestra Segunda Plegaria Eucarística.

Así pues, lo que hacemos aquí al celebrar la Eucaristía hunde sus raíces en los mismos Evangelios que proclamamos y ya estaba ritualizado en los primeros siglos de la Iglesia.

También nosotros queremos caminar con Jesús por la vida. Apreciemos que este camino es el que nuestros hermanos y hermanas han estado haciendo junto con Jesús a lo largo de toda la historia de la Iglesia.

¡Feliz Tercer Domingo de Pascua a todos!

On the weekend of May 6-7, 2023, all people of the Diocese of Orange will have the opportunity to donate to the Parishes in Collaboration Collection. This collection is for the purpose of assisting parishes in the Diocese of Orange that exhibit ongoing needs that cannot be paid for by their ordinary income and have urgent needs (such as repairs and maintenance).

All money donated to this collection is put into a restricted fund that is administered by a group consisting of laity and clergy of the diocese. Parishes with needs as stated above may apply for grants from this fund to be used for their specific needs. Most recently the committee has focused the grants to safety issues including emergency electrical, plumbing repairs and roofing.

By participating in the Parishes in Collaboration Collection, all people of the Diocese of Orange are helping one another support the works of our parishes that struggle financially. Thank you for your generosity.

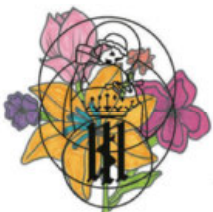


MASS INTENTIONS 2023

RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

“I Am Not Afraid — I Was Born to Do This.”

Have you ever felt like you weren't doing the work you should be doing?

We have all had jobs that leave us feeling unfulfilled. Bored. Dreading the next day. We may even experience a sensation of unfamiliarity, of being unable to recognize ourselves.

Most of us have also been lucky enough to have a job that we love — a vocation, a calling that makes us look in the mirror and think, *This. This is who I'm supposed to be. I recognize this person.*

For me, that work is the work of marriage and motherhood. The hours are terrible, the pay is even worse, and my coworkers are frequently disappointed in me — but it doesn't matter. When I look in the mirror every morning and see my tired, wrinkled face gazing back, choruses of “I said I don't want the BLUE SHIRT, MOMMY, ugh!” and “Honey, I've got an early meeting, I'm so sorry but I have to run,” ringing in the background, I think to myself: *I recognize this girl. She was born to do this.*

Christ's own disciples did not recognize him on the road to Emmaus. It wasn't until he took the bread and broke it that their eyes were opened, and they realized they had known it all along — “Were not our hearts burning within us?”

In that moment, Christ was doing the very work he was born to do, making the sacrifice.

I don't know what kind of vocation you are called to. I don't know what kind of work reveals your true self. But I hope that whatever work you are doing, you can look in the mirror and feel your heart burning within you.

RECONOCE A DIOS EN TUS MOMENTOS ORDINARIOS

“No tengo miedo, nací para hacer esto.”

¿Alguna vez has sentido que no estabas haciendo el trabajo que deberías estar haciendo?

Todos hemos tenido trabajos que nos dejan sintiéndonos insatisfechos. Aburridos. Temiendo al día siguiente. Incluso podemos experimentar una sensación de desconocimiento, de no poder reconocernos.

La mayoría de nosotros también hemos tenido la suerte de tener un trabajo que amamos, una vocación, un llamado que nos hace mirarnos en el espejo y pensar: Esto. Esto es lo que se supone que debo ser. Reconozco a esta persona.

Para mí, ese trabajo es el trabajo del matrimonio y la maternidad. Las horas son terribles, la paga es aún peor y mis compañeros de trabajo con frecuencia están decepcionados de mí, pero no importa. Cuando me miro en el espejo todas las mañanas y veo mi rostro cansado y arrugado mirándome, coros de “¡Dije que no quiero la CAMISA AZUL, MAMÁ, uf!” y “Cariño, tengo una reunión temprano, lo siento mucho, pero tengo que irme,” sonando de fondo, pienso para mí: reconozco a esta chica. Ella nació para hacer esto.

Los propios discípulos de Cristo no lo reconocieron en el camino a Emaús. No fue hasta que tomó el pan y lo partió que sus ojos se abrieron y se dieron cuenta de que lo habían sabido todo el tiempo: “¿No ardía nuestro corazón dentro de nosotros?”

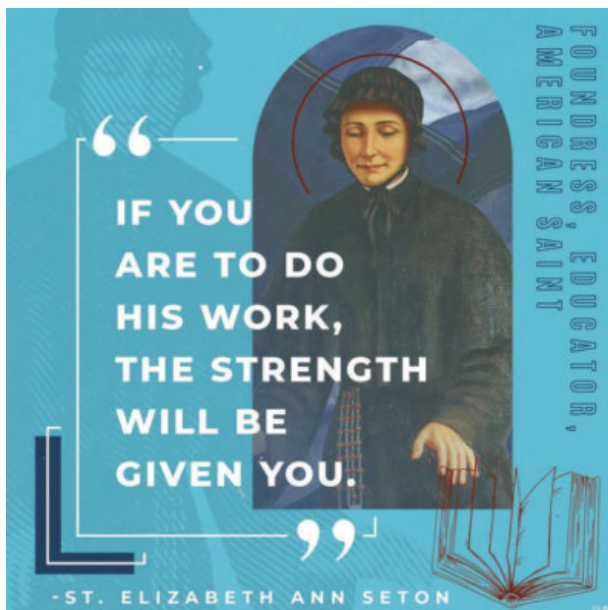
En ese momento, Cristo estaba haciendo el mismo trabajo para el que nació, haciendo el sacrificio.

No sé a qué tipo de vocación estás llamado. No sé qué tipo de trabajo revela tu verdadero yo. Pero espero que sea cual sea el trabajo que estés haciendo, puedas mirarte en el espejo y sentir que tu corazón arde dentro de ti.
