PASTORS PONDERINGS

Dear Parishioners,

Continuing to challenge us, if still quite gently, the Readings this Sunday look at our attitudes toward others and “to do better,” especially with regard to people who are different than us.

Both the First and Gospel Readings are about foreigners – in the first case about the General Namaan, an Aramean and in the Gospel Reading about a leper, among other lepers, but one who was Samaritan.

In both cases, the protagonists were not merely foreigners but ones from countries which the Israelites / Jews of the time did not particularly respect. Neither Namaan the Aramean nor the Samaritan leper were from big, powerful countries like Egypt or Babylon or Rome. Instead, they were from neighboring countries who were Israelites considered to be “on the same level” as they were, or who they thought the were better than.

Namaan may have been “a general” but of a small country, no more powerful than Israel would have been.

Still Namaan was a general and had almost certainly become accustomed to a certain level of respect. Now suddenly he found himself with a disease in which he was no longer in control of his own body, one in which pieces of his body were literally starting to rot and fall-off of him.

So came to the point of realizing that he needed help, even help from potential healer from another country. Swallowing his pride, he crossed the border to a foreign land, asking for help.

For his part, Elisha, a proud Israelite, didn’t want to be particularly helpful to a foreigner. So he literally told a servant of his tell the general to “jump in the river” and not just once but “seven times.”

It appears that Namaan was initially insulted by this but eventually did what he was told, and to everyone’s surprise he was healed. He came back to thank Elisha and Elisha still didn’t want to receive him. No matter, Namaan asked simply for two loads of dirt to take home with him saying that the only God he was going to worship from now on was the God of Israel.

In the Gospel Reading, Jesus healed 10 lepers and the only one who came back to thank him was a despised Samaritan. Can we better see the humanity and kindness of the people around us?

**PENSAMIENTOS DE NUESTRO PARROCO**

Queridos Feligreses,

Con un suave pero continuo desafío, las Lecturas de este Domingo nos invitan a examinar nuestra actitud hacia los demás, especialmente con respecto a quienes son diferentes a nosotros.

Tanto la Primera Lectura como el Evangelio tratan sobre extranjeros: en el primer caso, sobre el general Naamán, un Arameo, y en el Evangelio, sobre un leproso, entre otros leprosos, pero uno samaritano.

En ambos casos, los protagonistas no eran simplemente extranjeros, sino de países que los israelitas/judíos de la época no respetaban especialmente. Ni Naamán el Arameo ni el leproso samaritano provenían de países grandes y poderosos como Egipto, Babilonia o Roma. En cambio, provenían de países vecinos, cuyos israelitas consideraban estar a su mismo nivel, o a quienes consideraban “superiores.”

Naamán pudo haber sido "un general", pero de un país pequeño, no más poderoso que Israel.

Aun así, Naamán era general y podemos ser seguros que se acostumbró recibir un cierto nivel de respeto. De repente, se encontró con una enfermedad que le impedía controlar su propio cuerpo, una enfermedad en la que partes de su cuerpo comenzaban a pudrirse y a desprenderse.

Así que llegó al punto de comprender que necesitaba ayuda, incluso la de un posible sanador de otro país. Tragándose su orgullo, cruzó la frontera hacia un país extranjero en busca de ayuda.

Por su parte, Eliseo, un israelita orgulloso, no quería ayudar a este extranjero. Así que literalmente le dijo a un sirviente que le dijera al general que "saltara al río", y no solo una, sino "siete veces".

Parece que Naamán se sintió inicialmente insultado por esto, pero finalmente hizo lo que le dijeron y, para sorpresa de todos, se quedó sanado. Regresó para agradecerle a Eliseo, quien seguía sin querer recibirlo. No importaba, Naamán pidió por dos cargas de mula de tierra para llevar a su hogar porque el único Dios al que adoraría en adelante era el Dios de Israel.

En el Evangelio, Jesús sanó a diez leprosos y el único que regresó para agradecerle fue un samaritano despreciado. ¿Podemos apreciar mejor la humanidad y los hermanos nos rodean?
