PASTORS PONDERINGS

Dear Parishioners,

We are coming to the end of the Second Part of the Season of Lent. If the first part of Lent is always the same – we're signed with a cross of ashes on our foreheads on Ash Wednesday and reminded of our need to respect and believe more fully in the Gospel, then we're sent into the Desert with Jesus to remind us that we should depend on God rather than on the things of this world, and finally taken to the Mountain Top to get a glimpse of God's glory that awaits us – the second part of Lent always presents to us an ever expanding vision of God's salvific plan.

So on the Third Sunday of Lent we heard of the three times socially marginalized Samaritan Woman (marginalized because she was a foreigner, and then from a not particularly respected ethnicity, then because she was a woman, and finally because she was a woman with a problematic personal history) whom Jesus sought out and brought back into the Community.

Last Sunday, the Fourth Sunday of Lent we heard of the man born blind, now marginalized, written off because of his physical condition, who Jesus healed and brought into the Community.

Today, on the Fifth Sunday of Lent we hear of Jesus raising his friend, already four days deceased, from the dead and bringing him back into the Community.

We remember here that even the dead, the long dead, have a place in God's Kingdom, that truly everyone has a place, that everyone belongs.

In my time here at St. Philip Benizi, perhaps because of my rising age, perhaps simply because of circumstances big and small around us, that there will certainly be a "time after me" ☺, that just like our parents or grandparents lived during the Depression, and WW II or in Mexico during the time of the Revolution, and we ourselves during the Cold War – a lot of our parishioners here are Vietnam Vets – and 9/11 that there will come a time when all of this will become History.

Yet Jesus came to us in all times, be it St. Patrick's time, St. Francis' / the Seven Holy Founders' / St. Philip Benizi's time, be it St. Ignatius Loyola's, St. Frances Cabrini's, St. John Paul II's time, or more locally the time of the Roller Rink, the First Church, The Tent, Covid and Today. Jesus came for all of us, in all times. Let us give thanks for a God who cares for us all ... no matter "what time" it may be ...

**PENSAMIENTOS DE NUESTRO PARROCO**

Queridos Feligreses:

Estamos llegando al final de la segunda parte del tiempo de Cuaresma. Si la primera parte de la Cuaresma es siempre igual —somos marcados con la cruz de ceniza en la frente el Miércoles de Ceniza y se nos recuerda nuestra necesidad de respetar y creer más plenamente en el Evangelio; luego somos enviados al desierto con Jesús para recordarnos que debemos depender de Dios y no de las cosas de este mundo; y, finalmente, somos llevados a la cima de la montaña para vislumbrar la gloria de Dios que nos aguarda—, la segunda parte de la Cuaresma nos presenta siempre una visión cada vez más amplia del plan salvífico de Dios.

Así, en el tercer domingo de Cuaresma, escuchamos la historia de la mujer samaritana, marginada en tres sentidos (marginada por ser extranjera; por pertenecer a una etnia no particularmente respetada; por ser mujer; y, finalmente, por ser una mujer con un historial personal problemático), a quien Jesús buscó y reintegró a la comunidad.

El domingo pasado —el cuarto domingo de Cuaresma— escuchamos la historia del hombre que nació ciego, ahora marginado y descartado debido a su condición física, a quien Jesús sanó e integró a la comunidad.

Hoy, en el quinto domingo de Cuaresma, escuchamos cómo Jesús resucita a su amigo —que llevaba ya cuatro días muerto— y lo devuelve a la comunidad.

Recordamos aquí que incluso los muertos —aquellos que llevan mucho tiempo fallecidos— tienen un lugar en el Reino de Dios; que, verdaderamente, todos tienen un lugar; que todos pertenecen.

Durante mi tiempo aquí en San Felipe Benizi —quizás debido a mi edad que está avanzando, o tal vez simplemente por las circunstancias, grandes y pequeñas, que nos rodean—, fui bien consciente de que, ciertamente, habrá un «tiempo después de mí» ☺; de que, tal como nuestros padres o abuelos vivieron durante la Gran Depresión y la Segunda Guerra Mundial o en México durante la época de la Revolución —y nosotros mismos durante la Guerra Fría (muchos de nuestros feligreses aquí son veteranos de Vietnam) y el 11 de septiembre—, llegará un momento en que todo esto pasará a formar parte de la historia.

Sin embargo, Jesús vino a nosotros en todos los tiempos: ya fuera en la época de San Patricio; en la de San Francisco, la de los Siete Santos Fundadores o la de San Felipe Benizi; en la de San Ignacio de Loyola, la de Santa Francisca Cabrini o la de San Juan Pablo II; o, pensando en lo más local, en los tiempos de la Pista de Patinaje, de la Primera Iglesia, de «La Carpa», de la COVID y de hoy. Jesús vino por todos nosotros, en todos los tiempos. Demos gracias por un Dios que cuida de todos nosotros... sin importar «qué tiempo» sea...
